REPORT ON STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK

1st Multiplier Event – Training, Journey and Learn (TRIP)

Italy, 23-28 July 2025

At the end of the 1st multiplier event of the TRIP project, organised as part of the XIV edition of the “Sa Corona Arrùbia” International Folklore Festival in Genoni and the neighbouring Sardinian villages, with a gala evening in Setzu, live on Videolina, a final discussion and feedback session was held with the participants. The event was organized by Fondazione Altopiano della Giara and was part of the first dissemination phase of the project. For reporting purposes, 73 participants out of 75 attendees provided feedback on the event by means of the Stakeholder Feedback Form prepared for the occasion. The comments, provided orally, were collected by a member of staff at the Altopiano della Giara Foundation. The event agenda focused on the general presentation of the TRIP project, the partnership, the implementation stages and results achieved, discussion with participants, adult education challenges and opportunities, the impact of European projects on non-formal and informal education and future opportunities for cooperation.

The responses showed a very high level of satisfaction with the event. Participants expressed very positive opinions regarding the overall organization of the initiative, the relevance of the topics addressed, the quality of the presentations and the clarity of the information shared about the TRIP project. Stakeholders also appreciated the opportunities for discussion, exchange and networking created during the event.

With regard to the project content, participants confirmed that the event helped them better understand the general objectives of the TRIP project, the composition of the partnership and the role of each partner, as well as the implementation stages and the results achieved so far. These dimensions are fully consistent with the project framework, its partnership structure and the work plan presented.

The presentation of the research phase was considered clear and useful, especially in relation to the comparative work carried out in Italy, Poland and Romania. Particular appreciation was expressed for the presentation of the Joint Report, which was seen as an important project output. Participants highlighted that the report helped them better understand the training needs, expectations and soft skills emerging from the partner countries and that it clearly showed how the evidence collected already contributes to the structure of the TRIP model that will be further developed in the next project phases. the research-and-design phase and explains that the evidence collected is being translated into modular training itineraries and an educational proposal for the TRIP model.

The discussion on the challenges and opportunities in adult education and lifelong learning was also positively evaluated, as well as the session dedicated to the impact of European projects on the development of non-formal and informal education. Participants considered these topics relevant for their own professional and community contexts and appreciated the broader reflection on European cooperation, local development and lifelong learning. The discussion on future cooperation opportunities was considered motivating and useful for strengthening future stakeholder involvement.

The feedback also showed that the event had a positive perceived impact on participants. Many stakeholders stated that the initiative increased their knowledge of adult education and European cooperation projects and encouraged them to reflect on the possible application of research-based and experiential approaches in their own work. The responses also indicated strong interest in following the future development of the TRIP project and in maintaining contact for possible collaboration opportunities. This is coherent with the project's wider goals of promoting experiential learning, transversal skills, active participation, cultural awareness and European citizenship.

The open comments further confirmed the positive reception of the event. Participants highlighted the informative character of the sessions, the relevance of the themes discussed, the value of presenting the Joint Report at this stage of the project, and the importance of involving local communities and stakeholders in the dissemination process. The fact that the multiplier event was embedded in the "Sa Corona Arrùbia" International Folklore Festival further strengthened the visibility of the project and created a meaningful connection between adult education, local identity, cultural heritage and community participation.

Judging by the feedback, the 1st Multiplier Event successfully achieved its objectives, strengthened the visibility of the TRIP project at local level and generated a high level of stakeholder engagement.
