Training, journey and learn

BRIEF REPORT ON STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK

2nd Multiplier Event – Training, Journey and Learn (TRIP) Bucharest, 12–13 March 2026

At the end of the dissemination conference organized within the project *Training, Journey and Learn – TRIP*, a final discussion and feedback session was held with the participants. During this session, 71 participants provided feedback on the event by means of the Stakeholder Feedback Form prepared for the conference. The feedback was collected by a member of the CONIL team.

The responses showed a very high level of satisfaction with the event. Participants expressed very positive opinions regarding the overall organization of the conference, the relevance of the topics addressed, the quality of the presentations, and the clarity of the information shared about the TRIP project. The stakeholders also appreciated the interactive sessions, the opportunities for discussion and exchange of good practices and the networking dimension of the event.

With regard to the project content, participants confirmed that the conference helped them better understand the objectives of the TRIP project, the progress and results achieved so far, and the concept of the digital platform to be developed within the project. The proposed methodology based on experiential learning was considered relevant and valuable for the field of adult education, and the examples presented during the conference were seen as useful and inspiring for future professional practice.

The feedback also showed that the event had a positive perceived impact on participants. Many stakeholders stated that the conference increased their knowledge of adult education and European cooperation projects and encouraged reflection on the possible use of experiential learning approaches in their own work. The responses also indicated strong interest in following the future development of the TRIP project and in potential future collaboration opportunities.

The open comments shared during the final exchange further confirmed the positive reception of the event. Participants highlighted the informative character of the conference, the relevance of the themes discussed and the value of the intercultural and professional dialogue created among attendees from different backgrounds. Dissemination conference successfully achieved its objectives, strengthened the visibility of the TRIP project and generated a high level of stakeholder engagement.
